

Responding to Sexual Harassment and Sexual Violence Abroad

Title IX [which prohibits discrimination based on sex] also **applies to students abroad** experiencing sexual harassment, violence or sex-based misconduct

WHAT TYPES OF INCIDENTS CAN I REPORT?

Sexual violence

Sexual assault

Stalking

Dating or domestic violence

Invasion of sexual privacy

Sexual intercourse with a person under the age of 18

Retaliation

Sexual harassment or discrimination based on sex, gender or sexual orientation

Exposure of another person's genitals in a public place for sexual gratification

Failure to comply with a no-contact order, suspension or exclusion issued under the UC Sexual Violence and Harassment Policy

Sexual **assault** isn't just rape, it's any sexual penetration or contact without **consent**

Stalking is any repeated behavior of a sexual or romantic nature of motivation that causes **fear**

WHAT ARE MY RIGHTS?

An educational environment free from sexual violence and harassment

Reasonable academic accommodations

An internal investigation of a reported incident

Confidential support services
